Council Meeting Report

Council met on Sunday 10 May. The following was discussed:

- Payment of AUSTAT membership fees for students currently participating in a training course will be delayed until training schools are reopened with face to face lessons. Students will be officially notified of this.
 - AUSTAT Council discussed advice regarding the COVID Emergency, in light of the new government guidelines, It was agreed "wait until Step 2 of Roadmap to a Covid Safe Australia" is implemented in their area before resuming face to face teaching. When resuming face to face teaching, teachers should adhere to precautions as advised. (details below)
 - Jenny Thirtle has been approved as an AUSTAT Moderator.
 - AUSTAT library is set to go online; stay tuned for more information.
 - Ted Dimon's workshop series continues to available to AUSTAT members (see below)
 - Council are looking into more opportunities for online learning. We are currently investigating other workshops to share with our members.

Advice regarding face-to-face teaching

Council advises the Alexander teaching community may consider resuming face-to-face teaching when step-two of a three-step plan to reopen Australia, after the coronavirus crisis, commences in their respective states.

While step-two will be a significant step toward normality, it does not mean we are back to business as usual. Precautions will need to be taken to reduce the risk of contact with suspected cases of COVID-19 and to prevent the risk of transmission. The current Victorian government guidelines advise face masks for close contact work.

Teachers are advised to follow local governmental guidelines for close contact work and which 'personal services' are permitted.

This symposium addresses an urgent need for specific, up-to-date, science-based models to help AT practitioners to:

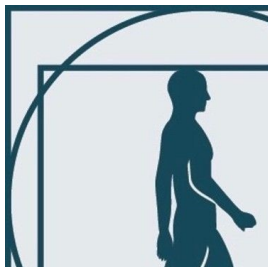
- better understand what we are learning and teaching physiologically
